Post: ECT Class Teacher **Grade:** Main Scale- M1

Responsible to: Headteacher

Main Responsibilities:

- To carry out the duties of a Class Teacher as set out in the School Teacher's Pay and Conditions
- To establish good relationships, encourage good working practices and support, challenge and class teachers and support staff
- To provide regular and specific communication with parents/carers
- To provide for the pastoral, educational, social, moral, spiritual and cultural development of the children and be committed to a fully inclusive approach to learning
- To be responsible and accountable for securing the highest standards of pupil achievement through a process of effective monitoring, evaluation, reporting and review of learning, progress and teaching outcomes
- To address any areas of underachievement and inconsistencies
- To use relevant assessment information to help set targets for improvement
- To enthuse, lead, develop and enhance the teaching practices of others through mentoring, coaching, evaluating, supporting, guiding and target setting
- To be accountable for the strategic leadership and management within the context of the school's aims and policies
- To take responsibility for improving teaching through appropriate professional development and in responding to constructive advice and feedback
- To communicate effectively with parents with regard to pupils' achievements and well-being
- To provide day to day management of staff including absences and the co-ordination and supervision of additional adults working with the children
- To support the induction of new staff
- To make significant contributions to year group preparation, planning and assessment processes
- To use data effectively to make informed choices about the curriculum
- To liaise with other phases to ensure curricular continuity and progression
- To liaise with external agencies including those providing advisory services



- To monitor the quality of teaching and learning, resourcing and administration
- To interact on a professional level with colleagues, establishing and maintaining good working relationships
